

IMAGINE THIS

Imagine it's two in the morning, pitch black outside, and raining hard.

You're trying to find an address on an unlit rural road. All the houses are off the road on long private drives and the mailboxes have small numbers on them, if they are numbered at all.

Now imagine you are in an ambulance or fire engine having just been awakened and dispatched to an emergency.

Seconds count. Just ask anyone who has had an emergency how it felt to wait after they dialed 911.

Not all of our responses are like this, but a growing number are. Here at CCFD #5 we are experiencing this more and more. New construction, coupled with new roads and private driveways, has made it difficult to find residences during an emergency.

This problem is magnified by poor address markers, no numbers on houses, or driveways not properly marked.

When you're having the worst day of your life we want to get to you as soon as possible.

Please make sure your houses, driveways, and roads are clearly marked. Make it clear enough that a stranger could find your house in the dark.

Flu Facts

The flu is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe illness, and at times can lead to death.

Symptoms of flu include, fever (usually high), headache, extreme tiredness, dry cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, Stomach symptoms, such as nausea, vomiting, and diarrhea, also can occur but are more common in children than adults.

Complications of flu can include bacterial pneumonia, ear infections, sinus infections, dehydration, and worsening of chronic medical conditions, such as congestive heart failure, asthma, or diabetes.

The single best way to prevent seasonal flu is to get a flu vaccination each year.

People who should get vaccinated each year include:

- Children age 6 months to 5 years
- Pregnant women
- Persons 50 years and older
- People of any age with certain chronic medical conditions
- People who live in nursing homes and other long term care facilities
- Healthcare workers

The flu vaccine is not for everyone including:

- People who have a severe allergy to chicken eggs.
- People who have had a severe reaction to an influenza vaccination in the past.
- People who developed <u>Guillain-Barré syndrome (GBS)</u> within 6 weeks of getting an influenza vaccine previously
- Children less than 6 months of age
- People who have a moderate or severe illness with a fever should wait to get vaccinated until their symptoms lessen

WINTER IS HERE, TIME TO BE PREPARED

Now that winter has arrived, it is important to remember that heavy snows, icy conditions and cold temperatures can occur at any time. To protect you and your loved ones from the effects of our Northwest winter weather, follow these safety tips:

- Keep an emergency supply kit in your home that includes a battery-powered radio, bottled water, canned food, a manual can opener, flashlights and battery-powered lamps for power failures. Remember, if the power goes out, turn off any electrical items or appliances you may have been using such as; stove, oven, iron, heaters, etc, it can be minutes or even days before the power may be restored.
- Are your smoke alarms working? Have you practiced and talked about your escape plan with your loved ones?
- Layer your clothing to protect yourself from the cold. A hat, scarf and mittens are also essential protection against winter weather.
- Always have enough gas in your car to get to a safe place in case of an emergency. Make sure it is in proper working condition and includes blankets, warm clothing, booster cables and tools, bottled water, a first aid kit, flashlights, small shovel, tire chains, ice scraper and a cell phone.
- Make sure your Christmas tree is watered; turn off lights while sleeping and when not at home.
- And finally, check the condition of your heating sources such as; a fireplace, woodstove, furnace and all heaters. Remove all flammable items at least 3 feet away from all heating sources.
