OUTDOOR SAFETY TIPS

Go ahead, get outside, have fun in the sun, and practice safety everyday!

- **Limber up** Yard work that may seem easy will involve muscles that you haven't used in a while.
- Wear appropriate ppe- protect your legs, hands, eyes & ears from hazardous materials while doing yard work.
- SPF 30+ is recommended for every one. Sunburns can produce 2nd degree burns.
- Enforce "NO HELMET, NO BIKE RIDING". If your child needs a helmet we can provide them FREE with a simple phone call. (Provided by Safe Kids Coalition)

- When outdoor burning never add fuel to the fire after it has been started. Even a smoldering fire can flare up and follow the stream back to the container.
- Inspect your BBQ before grilling. Inspect hoses on gas grills and never use a gas grill indoors.
- Keep pool toys out of the pool when not in use. They can be to inviting to young children when no one is around.
- Drink water- Dehydration can cause headaches, stomach aches and other not-so-fun symptoms. Keep cold water with you whatever you do.
- Use caution with fireworks even sparklers can cause burns if not handled properly.

"Lets get it going" replied Larry Fleming, president of the Kalama Volunteer Firefighters Association, to the topic on the floor of creating a work out room. The motion was made and passed unopposed.

Within a few weeks the Volunteer Association had reached an agreement with Fire District #5 Commissioners to overhaul an old shed in to a work out room. The acquired pole building had leaks, holes in the sheeting and insufficient lighting, but this would not detour the determined Firefighters.

A few months went by, along with several work parties and the "Fitness Shed" began to take shape.. The shed was a "shanty" said firefighter Richard VanRiper, "It took a lot of work". Most of the material and all of the labor was donated by volunteers.

The roof is repaired and insulated, the siding is straight, there are walls and carpet and lights. The old shed now looks as good as any up town gym.

Members donated some of the workout equipment and the rest was purchased from an out of business gym in Woodland. The "Fitness Shed" is now getting lots of use from the local volunteer firefighters.

CHIEF LEATZOW HONORED


In February our very own Chief, Victor Leatzow was honored by the men and women of the VFW at the Veterans of Foreign Wars State Conference in Spokane, WA.
