OUTDOOR SAFETY

Warmer weather is on the way and with it comes more opportunities for outdoor activities. Remember these tips to help keep your sunny days safe.

- Apply sunscreen BEFORE you go in the sun. Sunscreens need time to absorb before they are fully effective.
- Stay hydrated! Water is the best beverage while you enjoy your outdoor activities. If you are drinking other beverages be sure to take along water to drink in between so you don't suffer from dehydration.
- Set good examples for children by wearing your bicycle helmets. Not only is it safer for you but children are more likely to wear their helmets if parents wear theirs.



- Make sure the lifejackets still fit. The kids are growing up fast so make sure to test fit their old life jackets BEFORE that family boat ride.
- Check the fire extinguishers in your campers, RV's and boats. A reliable fire extinguisher is a must-have if you're planning any road trips.
- Inspect your gas grill before using. If you smell gas, shut the valve off at the tank. Always keep propane tanks outdoors. Remember to keep all grills a safe distance away from your home or garage.
- Never swim or hike alone. Take a friend along and let someone who's not going with you know where you'll be.

Avoid strenuous outdoor activities this summer while the sun is at it's hottest point between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.



ANNUAL BURN BAN

July 15th through October 1st



During this time ALL residential and land clearing burning is strictly prohibited. Complaints and reports of illegal burning during the Burn Ban can be directed to the **Southwest Clean Air Agency**, toll free 1-800-633-0709. Visit their website for more information.

Recreational fires (consisting only of wood or charcoal) are allowed as long as they are in an approved fire pit, like the ones you find in campgrounds.

- The diameter of the pit cannot exceed 3 feet.
- Pit should be metal, stone or masonry lined.
- You must keep at least 10 feet around your fire pit completely clear of any combustible materials.
- Make sure to keep your fire pit at least 20 feet away from overhead fuels like branches and overhangs.
- Recreational fires must be attended by a responsible person 16 yrs old or older and they must have tools to extinguish the fire.

SPRING IS HERE, TIME TO PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WILDFIRE SEASON

Springtime is a great time to create a "Defensible Space" around your home. Every year, countless wildfires take lives and leave people homeless. Use these tips to help defend your home and protect your family.

- Keep trees and shrubs pruned. Prune all trees 6 to 10 feet from the ground. Keep your lawn mowed and watered regularly.
- Action Plan- The time to plan for a fire emergency is now. Plan a family fire drill & practice often.
- Lean, Clean and Green? Create a Defensible Space. Plant fire resistant plants that stay healthy and green throughout the year.
- At least one 10 pound ABC-class fire extinguisher should be available and check the smoke detectors in your home.
- Materials that are fire-resistant should be used on the exterior of the home. Brick, cement, plaster, stucco and fiber cement board are all heat and flame resistant materials.
- Access for Emergency Vehicles- identify your home and neighborhood with legible and clearly marked street names and numbers so emergency vehicles can rapidly find the location of the emergency. Your driveway needs to be 12 feet wide and have an overhead clearance of at least 15 feet to provide access to emergency vehicles.
